This 6-part training series will provide relevant information about American Sign Language interpreting in general and specifically related to Deaf interpreting. Participants will have the opportunity via discussion, lecture and role-play to understand the role of the Deaf interpreter, theory & practice of Deaf interpreting, team interpreting, ethical considerations & challenges, and

the consumer assessment process. Additionally, Diversity in the Deaf Community and Deaf Interpreting: Past, Present and Future will be explored.
